NEED HELP PAYING YOUR HEATING BILL?

Find out if WAFF can help.

Eligibility and Qualifications

1 Apply at the Salvation Army office where you live.

Assistance is available in:

- District of Columbia (see other side for locations)
- Maryland (see other side for locations)
- Virginia (see other side for locations)

2 WAFF Energy Assistance is distributed primarily based on **family income and size.**

3 WAFF pays for all types of heating sources including natural gas, electricity, oil, or another fuel source.

4 To be eligible, you must be in an **emergency situation and have received the maximum government energy assistance.**

- If you are a **gas or electric heating customer**, you must have a disconnection notice from your utility. WAFF only pays for the primary heating source.

The Salvation Army administers the distribution of WAFF funds to residential heating customers.

WHEN AND WHERE TO APPLY

WAFF applications are accepted January 1 through May 31. To apply for WAFF assistance, you must go to The Salvation Army office where you live.
